	Working groups: Define the problem statement and target population	Each 'barrier group' has a clear definition of the problem statement and the target population for their problem	Lobby and break out rooms
	Working groups: Value proposition	Each 'barrier group' articulates the value of solving specific problems, prioritizing the root causes	Lobby and break out rooms
	Working groups: Key players, stakeholders, and relationships	Each 'barrier group' understands whose participation and support is needed to address their problem	Lobby and break out rooms
Session 2 10:00-12:00	Synthesis and preparation for report outs	Working groups by target population discuss and agree on what to present for their target populations	Lobby and break out rooms
